COMMON NAME	BOTANICAL NAME	DESCRIPTION
Spotted Gum	<i>Corymbia maculata</i>	A premium Australian hardwood
Tasmanian Oak	<i>E. felegatensis</i> , <i>E. obliqua</i> and <i>E. regnans</i>	A quality Australian hardwood comprising of three species
Blackbutt	<i>Eucalyptus pilularis</i>	A strong and large Australian hardwood
Australian Chestnut	<i>E. oblique</i> , <i>E. sieberi</i> , <i>E. fastigata</i>	An Australian hardwood that is a blend of species
Sydney Blue Gum	<i>Eucalyptus saligna</i>	A very large Australian native hardwood
Jarrah	<i>Eucalyptus marginata</i>	A unique Western Australian hardwood
Tallowwood	<i>Eucalyptus microcorys</i>	A coastal Australian hardwood
Brush Box	<i>Lophostemon confertus</i>	A very dense and unique Australian hardwood
Merbau	<i>Insia bijuga</i>	Hardwood from South East Asia
Ironbark <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grey Ironbark • Red Ironbark 	<i>E. paniculata</i> <i>E. sideroxylon</i>	Distinctive Australian Hardwood
Fijian Mahogany	<i>Swietenia macrophylla</i>	A Brazilian timber plantation grown in Fiji
Treated Pine	<i>Pinus radiata</i>	Native to California, plantation grown throughout Australia and New Zealand
